## ICT Week

The Caribbean Telecommunications Union (CTU), in collaboration with the Government of Trinidad and Tobago, will be hosting several ICT events, centered on the **Caribbean ICT Roadshow** initiative commencing in January 2011 and culminating with several days of ICT activities from 7<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> February 2011. Called **ICT Week**, these activities have been designed to demonstrate the power and potential of information and communication technologies (ICT) to foster development and transform societies and economies.

ICT has become a significant element of the development strategy for nation building in the Caribbean. The Government of Trinidad and Tobago recognises that ICT presents opportunities to strengthen and develop more efficient and productive governance and business systems; to define and develop new types of jobs and business; to build the capacity of citizens; and to enhance Trinidad and Tobago's global competitiveness.

In keeping with its commitment to ICT-enabled development, the Government of Trinidad and Tobago is partnering with the CTU to host the ICT Week activities and events, which include:

There will be a strong emphasis on innovation and entrepreneurship in the use of ICT.

## ICT Week Activities\*

### 1. The Caribbean ICT Roadshow: General Fora (Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> to Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2011)



The Caribbean ICT Roadshow initiative has been developed by the CTU to raise awareness within the public sector, the private sector, civil society and academia of the need for innovation in embracing ICT effectively in all sectors in order to promote social and economic development. The Roadshow initiative adopts a unique approach, linking the dissemination of information to activities that will reinforce the message and produce tangible benefits for the citizens of Trinidad & Tobago.

The CTU is working collaboratively with the Government of Trinidad and Tobago, partners and other interested organisations and institutions to deliver a Roadshow customised to address Trinidad & Tobago's developmental issues and to demonstrate the transformative power of ICT innovation.

The theme, **Harnessing the Power of Innovation - *the engine for ICT-enabled Caribbean development***, reflects the objectives the Roadshow aspires to achieve, namely:

1. To build awareness among the public sector, the private sector and civil society of the innovative and effective use of ICT;
2. To foster innovation in the application of ICT to Caribbean challenges in government, the private sector and civil society; and
3. To accelerate the effective use of ICT by governments in order to promote transparency and efficiency in the delivery of public services.

- Harnessing the Power of Innovation Forum,
- ICT for Small & Medium Businesses Forum,
- Hot Seat Panel Discussion,
- CTU & Partners at your Service Forum,

## 2. The Caribbean ICT Roadshow: Exhibition

(Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2011)

An exhibition of ICT equipment and services is open to all participants and to the general public.

## 3. The Caribbean ICT Roadshow: Youth Forum

(Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2011 – By invitation only)

Special emphasis will be placed on the youth of the nation and their keen affinity to ICT in the Youth Forum, which will seek to educate and promote responsible and beneficial use of ICT and Internet resources. There will be sessions that will point to the dangers in cyberspace and will introduce parents and guardians to important issues relating to their children's interactions in cyberspace.

## 4. The Caribbean ICT Roadshow: Community Outreach

### Programme

(Commencing 5<sup>th</sup> January 2011)



The Caribbean ICT Roadshow initiative has been designed to engage every sector of the national community. In order to accomplish this goal, the Roadshow's activities will initially visit five communities in Trinidad and Tobago as a part of the Caribbean ICT Roadshow.

Community outreach activities will commence in January, 2011. Initially, Siparia, Moruga, Sangre Grande, Couva and San Fernando have been selected for outreach programmes. In addition, running concurrently with the Caribbean ICT Roadshow's General Fora, a Community Outreach Programme will take place at the Trinidad Hilton on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February. The Outreach Programme begins with an explanation of the term Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and then provide practical and educational sessions on the use of readily available ICT tools. Participants will be instructed on how to use ICT to improve efficiency and productivity. There will also be interactive sessions on topics which include social media, what parents don't know and dangers in cyberspace.

People who are experiencing problems with their computer or have questions on how to use them effectively, may visit the Computer Clinic for a diagnosis of the problem and to obtain information on solving them.

*iGovTT's* **ttconnect** express buses will be present at most venues to assist citizens in using facilities on the buses to obtain government services.

It is anticipated that this Programme will continue as more and more communities host the Community Outreach Programme.



## **5. CTU Caribbean ICT Innovation and Entrepreneurship (I&E) Workshop (Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> to Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2011 – Registration required)**

CTU recognises the leading role that ICT plays across all sectors of our economy and the need for innovation in realising ICT's potential to transform existing industries, create new ones, enhance the Region's competitiveness, assist with solutions to environmental problems, and enhance social inclusion.

While some national initiatives are taking place, Governments of the region need support in creating an environment that is conducive to encouraging and facilitating an innovative spirit and cultivating entrepreneurs. This Innovation and Entrepreneurship Workshop seeks therefore to offer this support by educating and inspiring innovators from the Caribbean region to commercialise their ideas.

Messrs Julian Hall and Mark Lewis, from Pure Online Genius and Bravig Ltd respectively, UK entrepreneurs and members of the Caribbean Diaspora, will facilitate an empowering and practical two-day Workshop that will be delivered in two parts:

### **i) A Framework for Innovation**

During the first day our speakers will examine the concepts, thought processes and problem solving techniques that make true innovation possible. Through engaging the audience on real issues and taking into account their personal circumstances, the team will seek to find answers to common problems which entrepreneurs face and walk the audience through simple step-by-step exercises designed to promote ideas which will lead to commercial success.

### **ii) Becoming an Entrepreneur**

Day two will consist of a series of interactive exercises which will encourage the audience to engage and participate in driving their vision forward. They will be encouraged to become constructively critical of their own ideas; to examine new ways to source financing; to learn from the experiences of others in business; to create mutually beneficial strategic partnerships; to identify and acquire the skills they personally lack and to cultivate a determination to move forward.

At the end of the second day, we will summarise the journey of the Innovators and Entrepreneurs, award certificates of progress and guide the candidates through the next steps towards success. Candidates will leave with a personally tailored business development plan and the energy and focus to implement it effectively.

Delegates whose ideas receive favourable review will be awarded special prizes and will be invited to participate in follow-up assessment sessions with the facilitators which will be scheduled on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2011. These delegates may also benefit from additional training, internships, mentorship programmes, guidance, research and business support to enable them to commercialise their ideas and to establish sustainable ICT-businesses.

The I&E Workshop will culminate in a Book Launch, in which Mr. Julian Hall, CEO of Pure online Genius, will promote his new book "10 Secrets of Social Media Marketing – The No Nonsense Guide for Entrepreneurs and Business Owners".

## **6. Technology Display: ICT Business Solutions**

**(Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> – Friday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2011)**

## **8. CTU 8<sup>th</sup> Ministerial ICT Strategic Seminar**

**(Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2011 – By invitation only)**

The unrelenting pace of technological innovation and the attendant convergence of information and communication sectors have dismantled the traditional frameworks which governed the telecommunications sector in the past. An understanding of the new and emerging technologies is essential for policy development for, and legislation and regulation of the sector.

The 8<sup>th</sup> Caribbean Ministerial ICT Strategic Seminar will create a forum for Government Ministers, senior policy makers and regulators to be updated on the emerging telecommunications technologies through interactive sessions with industry players. The Seminar will lay a foundation of understanding of ICT tools and technologies and their potential impact on social and economic development.

## **9. Electronic Numbering (ENUM) Seminar**

**(Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2011 – By invitation only)**

This Seminar on Electronic Numbering (ENUM) will explore why the system was developed; the differences between the two major types of ENUM, and the implementation status of each type in North America and around the world.

The Seminar will describe the role that the Country Code 1 ENUM LLC is playing in implementing ENUM and will identify and explain the opportunities that Operators will have in implementing Provider ENUM to support and enable various telecommunications services, including IP-based network interconnection and next-generation mobility services.
